

## **'GAY RAIDERS' INVADE CRONKITE NEWS SHOW**

C.B.S. Evening News was disrupted briefly last night when a demonstrator from an organization called "The Gay Raiders" ran in front of the camera and held up a yellow sign saying "Gays Protest CBS Prejudice."

The incident occurred about 14 minutes into the first "feed" of the C.B.S. News program, which is anchored by Walter Cronkite and broadcast live at 6:30 P.M. from the studios in New York over most of the network's affiliates.

The demonstration was re-run as a news item on the second "feed" of the show, which is broadcast at 7 and seen on the network's local affiliate, Channel 2, and on a few other stations on the East Coast.

A spokesman for C.B.S. News said the demonstrator, who identified himself as Mark Allan Segal, had called the network last week. Using a different name and pretending to be a reporter for the Camden State Community College newspaper in New Jersey, he secured permission to watch the show from within the studio.
